



**Seeking Arabic, Chinese & Spanish professional interpreters for
research project on police interpreting
June – July 2017, Sydney**

If you are a Professional NAATI accredited Spanish, Chinese, or Arabic interpreter, you are invited to participate in a study about the effectiveness of interpreted communication in police interviews.

You will be invited to attend a police interview as interpreter. The interview will be scheduled at a mutually convenient time and you will be advised of the CBD venue if you decide to participate. The interview will last approximately 30 minutes and will be audio and video recorded for subsequent analysis.

Prior to the interview, you will be asked to answer a short questionnaire about your experience and qualifications. This will take about 10-15 minutes to complete. Following the interview, you will be asked to complete another short questionnaire about your impressions of the interview, and you will be debriefed.

All your personal details will remain strictly confidential. You will not be identified in any subsequent publication of the results.

You will receive a \$100 Coles/Myer gift voucher for your participation. The total participation time will be approximately one hour. You can count this activity towards your NAATI revalidation points, under section 5.7 of the catalogue, for 10 PD points.
